The purpose of the survey is to enable Resident Coordinators to provide feedback on the countrylevel implementation of the QCPR, including the repositioning of the UNDS, with the ultimate purpose to improve UN development system support to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda. The results of the survey will be used in the preparation of the next Secretary-General's report on the implementation of the quadrennial comprehensive policy review of operational activities for development of the United Nations system and the report of the UNSDG Chair on the Development Coordination Office (DCO) and the Resident Coordinator (RC) system to be presented to the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly in 2024¹.
