## **2023 Government Survey** on UN operational activities for development

Welcome to this survey on UN development cooperation, requested by the UN General Assembly.

The aim of the survey is to give all countries an opportunity to provide feedback on the performance of the UN development system in support of their effort to implement the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The survey addresses the follow-up to the provisions of the General Assembly resolutions on UN development system operational activities, notably the GA resolution on the Ouadrennial Comprehensive Policy Review (OCPR) and the GA resolution on the repositioning of the UN development system. The survey results will serve as an important input to the work of the UN Economic and Social Council which oversees the UN system implementation of the quadrennial comprehensive policy review and the continued effectiveness, efficiency and relevance of UN operational activities for development.

The survey is composed of two parts:

- The first part is directed at programme country Governments, which have a UN resident coordinator office in their country, or are served by one through a multi-country office
- The second part is directed at Governments that provide voluntary financial resources to the UN development system.

Governments that are both programme country Governments and contribute financially to the operational activities for development of the UN are kindly asked to fill out both parts of the survey.

The survey is to be completed by senior government officials responsible for - or closely associated with - UN operational activities for development. We encourage you to consult with relevant colleagues across government who engage with UN entities. DESA will only share the survey responses with the UN Development Coordination Office (DCO), with a view towards making tailor-made improvements to the support provided by the UN country teams and Resident Coordinators. However, DCO will keep survey responses strictly confidential and will not share them with the Resident Coordinators' Offices.

### D. Resident Coordinators and UN country teams

General Assembly resolution 72/279 on the repositioning of the UN development system decided "to create a dedicated, independent, impartial, empowered and sustainable development-focused coordination function for the United Nations development system by separating the functions of the resident coordinator from those of the resident representative of the United Nations Development Programme, drawing on the expertise and assets of all United Nations development system entities, including non-resident agencies".

On 1 January 2019 the transition to the reinvigorated Resident Coordinator system was implemented. The new system, led in countries by a strengthened Resident Coordinator, is at the centre of the repositioned United Nations development system. With strengthened authority and impartiality, full-time leadership and enhanced capacities, the Resident Coordinator leads the United Nations country teams' contributions to countries' implementation of the 2030 Agenda.
