Reflections on the work of ECOSOC Subsidiary Bodies

The Chairs of ECOSOC functional commissions and expert bodies will present the most recent work of their respective bodies and provide a preview of forthcoming sessions, while highlighting recommendations, initiatives and normative frameworks that have the potential to accelerate the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Their collaboration with other subsidiary bodies and UN entities will also be highlighted.

Member States are invited to (i) reflect on the work of ECOSOC subsidiary bodies and proposals contained in the informal note prepared by the Secretariat, and (ii) provide action-oriented and forward-looking policy guidance to ensure coherence and direction in the policies and normative work of subsidiary bodies and UN system entities, including specialized agencies and international financial institutions, relating to the 2030 Agenda.

This session will give priority to the subsidiary bodies that are not in other parts of the programme to highlight their work. During the session, all Chairs will be invited to engage in a live, interactive exchange with Member States, the Bureau of the Council and Executive Secretaries of the regional commissions.

The format of the session will be a fireside chat with moderator. To make the discussion more interactive, there will be a mix of interventions by Chairs, Executive Secretaries of regional commissions and Member States. This will provide an opportunity to Member States to make an intervention at various points throughout this session.

The meeting will be interactive in nature and the moderator will intercalate the fireside chat with the Chairs with interventions from the floor. To stimulate an interactive conversation, delegations are strongly encouraged to deliver unscripted remarks and to make comments and pose questions to the Chairs and Executive Secretaries.
