

2024 Survey of Governments on UN operational activities for development

Welcome to this survey on UN development cooperation, requested by the UN General Assembly.

The aim of the survey is to give all countries of the UN development system an opportunity to provide feedback on the performance of the UN development system in support of their effort to implement the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The survey informs the reporting mandated in General Assembly (GA) resolution on the Quadrennial Comprehensive Policy Review (QCPR) ([A/RES/75/233](#)) and the GA resolution on the repositioning of the UN development system ([A/RES/72/279](#)) and will also inform, to the extent possible, the reporting on the 2024 GA resolution on QCPR when adopted. The survey results will serve as an important input to the work of the UN Economic and Social Council which oversees the UN system implementation of the quadrennial comprehensive policy review and the continued effectiveness, efficiency and relevance of UN operational activities for development.

The survey is composed of two parts:

The first part is directed at host country Governments, which have a UN resident coordinator office in their country, or are served by one through a multi-country office arrangement; The second part is directed at Governments that provide voluntary financial resources to the UN development system.

Governments that are both programme country Governments and contribute financially to the operational activities for development of the UN are kindly asked to fill out both parts of the survey.

The survey is to be completed by senior government officials responsible for - or closely associated with - UN operational activities for development. We encourage you to consult with relevant colleagues across government who engage with UN entities.
