Report of the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations on its 2023 regular session AS ADOPTED

(New York, 23 January-1 and 13 February 2023)

Summary

At its 2023 regular session, held from 23 January to 1 and 13 February 2023, the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations had before it 560 applications for consultative status, including 321 applications deferred from earlier sessions. Of the non-governmental organizations submitting those applications, the Committee recommended 214 for consultative status, deferred 296 for further consideration at its resumed session in 2023, closed without prejudice consideration of 49 applications of non-governmental organizations that had failed to respond to queries by the deadline of two business days (48 hours) before the beginning of each Committee session and took note of the request by one non-governmental organization to withdraw its application for consultative status. It also had before it 655 quadrennial reports, of which it took note of 543. The Committee heard 7 representatives of non-governmental organizations.

The present report contains two draft decisions on matters calling for action by the Economic and Social Council.

By draft decision I, the Council would:

(a) Grant consultative status to 214 non-governmental organizations;

(b) Note that the Committee decided to take note of the change of name of ten non-governmental organizations;

(c) Note that the Committee took note of the quadrennial reports of 543 non-governmental organizations, including new and deferred reports;

(d) Close without prejudice consideration of the requests for consultative status made by 49 non-governmental organizations after the organizations had failed to respond to queries by the deadline of two business days (48 hours) before the beginning of each Committee session;

(e) Note that the Committee decided to take note of the request by one non-governmental organization to withdraw its application for consultative status;

By draft decision II, the Council would take note of the present report.

6. At its 8th meeting on 26th January, the observer for Indonesia recalled that the Committee had considered the applications of the organizations Nationaal Papoea Vereniging '95/West Nieuw Guinea and West Papua Interest Association and decided to recommend that consultative status be granted to the organizations at its 4th

meeting on 24th January. He referred to a note verbale dated 25 January that had previously been circulated to the Committee, expressing his delegation's concerns regarding the applications of two organizations. He asserted that the applications of the organizations contained information indicating their intention to undertake activities that would undermine the sovereignty and territorial integrity of a member state in contravention of the United Nations Charter and requested the Committee to reconsider its recommendations and revisit the applications of the organizations.

7. The representative of India noted that the Committee does not revisit its recommendations after they are gavelled by the Chair. He stated that the Committee should reconsider the two applications, on an exceptional basis and without setting a precedent, due to the serious nature of the concerns raised by the observer for Indonesia and presented in the note verbale.

8. The representative of China emphasized that the participation of NGOs in UN activities should be in line with the UN charter and the ECOSOC resolution 1996/31 and concurred with the representative of India. The representatives of Algeria, Bahrain, Cuba, Eritrea, Nicaragua, and Pakistan also expressed support for the proposal for the Committee to reconsider of the applications of the two organizations on an exceptional basis, based on the serious nature of the concerns raised by the observer for Indonesia.

9. The representative of the United States expressed her delegation's concern regarding inconsistencies in the work of the Committee and the establishment of a new precedent in the Committee's practice. The representative of the United Kingdom also expressed her delegation's concern regarding the establishment of a new precedent in the Committee's practice.

10. The Committee decided to reconsider the applications of the two organizations, on an exceptional basis, under rule 57 of the ECOSOC Rules of Procedure.

Applications closed without prejudice

11. At its 8th meeting, on 26 January, the Committee decided to close without prejudice consideration of the applications of 49 NGOs that had not responded to the Committee's questions by the deadline of two business days (48 hours) before the beginning of each Committee session. (see chap. I, draft decision I (d)).

Request by a non-governmental organization to withdraw its application

12. At its 4th meeting on 24 January, the Committee decided to take note of the request of one non-governmental organization to withdraw its application for consultative status (see chap. I, draft decision I (e)).

B. New applications for consultative status and new requests for reclassification

13. The Committee considered item 3 (b) of its agenda, New applications for consultative status and new requests for reclassification, at its 2nd to 3rd meetings, held from 23 to 24 January and at its 11th meeting, held on 30 January. The Committee considered a total of 239 new applications for consultative status.

New applications recommended

14. Of the 239 organizations whose new applications had been received, the Committee recommended that the following **158** should be granted consultative status with the Council (see chap. I, draft decision I, subpara. (a))

16. At its 10^{th} meeting on 27 January, the Committee considered agenda item 4 (a), Deferred quadrennial reports submitted by non-governmental organizations in consultative status. It had before it a memorandum by the Secretary-General containing a compilation of 95 quadrennial reports submitted by NGOs in general and special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council deferred from previous sessions of the Committee held from 2005 to 2022 (E/C.2/2023/CRP.2)

B. Review of quadrennial reports submitted by non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Council

18. At its 9th meeting, on 27 January, the Committee considered agenda item 4 (b), New quadrennial reports submitted by non-governmental organizations in consultative status. It had before it notes by the Secretary-General containing 560 new quadrennial reports (E/C.2/2023/CRP.5 to 42,). The Committee took note of the quadrennial reports of 542 of the organizations (see chap. I, draft decision I, subpara. (c)). The Committee decided to defer consideration of the reports of the following 18 organizations:²

IV. Strengthening of the Non-Governmental Organizations Branch of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the Secretariat

19. At its 1st meeting, on 23 January, the Committee jointly considered the following agenda items and heard an oral report by the Secretariat: agenda item 5, Strengthening of the Non-Governmental Organizations Branch; agenda item 6, Review of the methods of work of the Committee: implementation of Council resolution 1996/31, including the process of accreditation of representatives of non-governmental organizations, and Council decision 1995/304; and agenda item 8, General voluntary trust fund in support of the United Nations Non-Governmental Organizations Informal Regional Network.

20. At its 1st meeting, on 23 January May, the Committee jointly considered the following agenda items and heard an oral report by the Secretariat: agenda item 5, Strengthening of the Non-Governmental Organizations Branch; agenda item 6,

Review of the methods of work of the Committee: implementation of Council resolution 1996/31, including the process of accreditation of representatives of non-governmental organizations, and Council decision 1995/304; and agenda item 8, General voluntary trust fund in support of the United Nations Non-Governmental Organizations Informal Regional Network.

21. The Director of the Office for Intergovernmental Support and Coordination for Sustainable Development recalled that the Declaration on the 75th anniversary of the United Nations underlines the need for cooperation across borders and across the whole of society to address the challenges facing the world today and commits to "make the United Nations more inclusive and engage with all relevant stakeholders, including non-governmental organizations". In that regard, she noted the important role of the Committee, through its work in equipping the United Nations to confront global challenges. She highlighted the important contributions of NGOs to work of the United Nations including the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals through their outreach to poorest and most vulnerable, advocacy for change, promotion of human rights, and generation of innovative ideas.

22. The Director welcomed the second round Consultations with NGOs in consultative status convened by the Committee on 13th December 2022 and noted that NGOs had provided valuable recommendations on how their engagement with the UN could be further strengthened. She informed the Committee that the Secretariat was exploring ways of following up on the recommendations and that it had convened information sessions to brief NGOs on how they could participate in upcoming events of ECOSOC and other bodies. She encouraged the Committee to build on the success of the consultations to further improve the access of NGOs in the work of the UN as envisioned in the UN Charter.

23. She provided the Committee with an update on the ongoing efforts of the Branch to provide support to NGOs. She pointed out that the Branch was facing severe resource constraints owing to the increase in the number of NGOs in consultative status, as well as those applying for consultative status, and reiterated her previous appeal to the Committee and Member States for support in securing adequate resources to facilitate its work. She further informed the Committee that the new enhanced information and communications technology system that the Secretariat is developing to replace the current systems to enable it to provide faster and improved services to the Committee and NGOs would be rolled by the end of the first quarter of 2023.

24. The representative of Cuba welcomed the update from the Secretariat regarding the development of the new enhanced information and communications technology system. He reiterated his delegation's previous request for the Secretariat to provide training to members of the Committee to familiarise them on the use of the new platform before its official roll out.

V. Review of the methods of work of the Committee: implementation of Council resolution 1996/31, including the process of accreditation of representatives of non-governmental organizations, and Council decision 1995/304

25. The Committee discussed issues related to its working methods at its 11th and 12th meetings on 30th January and at its 15th meeting on 1 February.

26. At its 11th meeting, on 30th January, the representative of Pakistan recalled that the Committee had decided at its 2022 regular session to establish a deadline of two business days (48 hours) before the beginning of each session for the receipt of responses provided by NGOs to its questions, to afford the Committee adequate time to review and consider those responses. She sought clarification from the Secretariat regarding responses that had been received from non-governmental organizations at the beginning of the second round of review of applications for consultative status. She stated that the Committee members had not been given adequate time to review the responses that had been uploaded in the paperless system shortly before the beginning of the session. She sought clarification from the Secretariat regarding the procedure for dealing with responses submitted by NGOs to the questions of the Committee during the session.

27. The Chief of the Non-Governmental Organizations Branch informed the Committee that all the questions posed orally by the Committee to non-governmental organizations are formulated in writing and transmitted by the Secretariat to non-governmental organizations during the Committee's session. He explained that there is a time lag between the time that the responses are received from NGOs are when they are uploaded on the paperless system for the Committee's review. In that regard, he pointed out that the Committee's questions are transmitted to non-governmental organizations through the CSOnet messaging system which is used by the NGO branch to communicate with non-governmental organizations. The responses received from the organizations through the messaging system are subsequently uploaded on the paperless system for the Committee's review.

28. He further clarified that the deadline of 2 business days (48 hours) established by the Committee at its 2022 regular session, was only applicable to responses from NGOs with deferred applications that had failed to respond to the questions posed by the Committee at its previous sessions, after three reminders and not to the new applications that had submitted their responses to the Committee's questions posed during the current session. He recalled that the Committee had initiated discussions on the establishment of a 24-hour deadline for the review of responses received during the Committee's sessions but that it had not reached a consensus on the matter.

29. The representative of Cuba recalled that the Committee had agreed to establish a 48-hour deadline prior to the beginning of the session, to give the Committee's adequate to take review the responses at its 2022 regular session but that it had failed to reach an agreement regarding the 24-deadline for the review of applications received during the session due to differences of opinion within the Committee. He concurred with the statement by Pakistan that that the Committee required additional time to analyse the responses received from NGOs during the session before the beginning of the second round of review of applications to enable them to take informed decisions. He further noted that the Committee does not have a clear approach for dealing with responses received from non-governmental organizations that receive a second question after the second round of review.

30. The representative of Pakistan stated that it was unfair to expect the Committee to review responses received from non-governmental organizations uploaded by the Secretariat on the paperless platform a few minutes before the beginning of the session and requested that the Committee address the matter during its informal consultations.

31. The representative of Türkiye shared the concerns expressed by the representatives of Cuba and Pakistan. He stated that the Committee should define a clear procedure for conducting the second round of review of the applications. He added that the Secretariat should ensure that the questions posed by the Committee

and the responses received from non-governmental organizations are transmitted in a transparent and timely manner.

32. In response to a question by the representative of Cuba, the Chief of NGO Branch clarified that as far as he remembers there was no precedent in the Committee's practice when it had conducted a third round of review of applications.

33. At its 12th meeting, the Secretariat pointed out that the application of a nongovernmental organization that had responded to the Committee's questions had inadvertently been overlooked during the second round of review of applications and the Chair requested the Committee to revisit the application. The representatives of Cuba, Eritrea, Pakistan, Türkiye, United States and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland requested clarification from the Secretariat regarding the practice of the Committee in such cases. Upon clarification by the Secretariat, the Committee agreed to review the response provided by the organization on the understanding that it was an exceptional measure to address a technical error and that it would not establish a precedent in the Committee's work.

34. At its 10th meeting on 27 January, the Committee took note of the change of name of ten non-governmental organizations.

VI. Consideration of special reports and complaints by Member States

35. There was no request for a special report.

VII. Organization of the session

A. Opening and duration of the session

36. The Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations held its 2023 regular session from 23 January – 1 and 13 February. The Committee held 15 meetings.

37. The session was opened by the Director of the Office for Intergovernmental Support and Coordination for Sustainable Development, Department of Economic and Social Affairs.

38. At the 1st meeting of the Committee, on 23 January, the Vice-Chair of the Committee, Ms. Petronella Nyagura (Zimbabwe), made opening remarks. She noted the role of the Committee as an important gateway for NGOs to engage with and contribute to the work of the United Nations by facilitating their access and participation to ECOSOC and its subsidiary bodies, as well as many UN meetings and monitoring their engagement of with the UN through quadrennial reports and pledged to work with the Committee in implementing its important mandate.

39. The representative of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland emphasized the vital significance of civil society to the work of the United Nations. He stated that civil society contributes to enriching the Organization's information base and ensuring the impact of its work on the ground. He reaffirmed his delegation's commitment to championing civil society participation at the United Nations and expressed regret at the efforts of a few member States to stifle the voices of NGOs. He stated that his delegation would seek the approval of all applications from all legitimate NGOs and scrutinize applications based strictly on the criteria stipulated in ECOSOC resolution 1996/31 namely, a) the active existence of the organization; b) independence of the organization from the government; c) non-harmful activities by the organization and d) adherence of the organization to the UN Charter. He expressed regret at the increased politicization of deferrals in the Committee as part of a wider trend of reprisals against organizations that sought to engage with the United Nations. He encouraged all Committee Members to use a fair and objective review process and avoid blocking NGO applications for political reasons in order to foster deeper civil society engagement at the UN and reduce the backlog in applications. He expressed his delegation's support for efforts to improve the working methods of the Committee and urged the Committee to support the UN's commitment to inclusive multilateralism by promoting a safe and welcoming space for civil society.

40. The representative of Algeria expressed his delegation's commitment to the implementation of the Committee's mandate in line with ECOSOC resolution 1996/31 and the United Nations Charter. He affirmed his delegation's belief in the crucial role of civil society in enhancing the work of the United Nations and ensuring effective responses to global challenges including the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals. He stated that his delegation's approach is rooted in its Constitution and national laws which entrust the state with the responsibility of facilitating the participation of civil society in the conduct of public affairs. He cited as examples of the simplification of the procedures for the establishment of associations and the establishment of the National Observatory for Civil Society. He recalled the declaration of the thirty-first session of the Council of the League of Arab States at the summit level, hosted by Algeria in November 2022, which underlined the need to strengthen relations between Arab institutions and civil society actors. He further highlighted the forum hosted by Algeria in September 2022, in preparation for the Arab Summit, with the participation of civil society activists, influencers, and senior academic figures representing nineteen (19) Arab countries to discuss the role of the civil society. He emphasized the importance of promoting geographical balance in the representation of civil society from developing countries in the work of the United Nations and ensuring that their voice is heard in order to reflect the diversity of civil society around the world and reaffirmed his delegation's commitment to strengthening the role of civil society as an indispensable partner to the UN.

41. The representative of Türkiye underlined the vital role of NGOs in supporting local, national, regional, and global development processes and noted that their participation promotes local ownership, civic engagement, and accountability. He stated that the cooperation between the UN and civil society contributes to the sustainability and effectiveness of the UN's work and noted the Committee's crucial role in facilitating this cooperation. He welcomed the contributions of NGOs in consultative status to the work of the UN and affirmed his delegation's support to the granting of consultative status, in conformity with the spirit, purposes and principles of the United Nations Charter, as well as the framework of ECOSOC resolution 1996/31. He commended the Committee for the steps it had taken towards enhancing the transparency and efficiency of its work and addressing issues related to its working methods and expressed the hope that those efforts would result in the efficient fulfilment of its mandate. He stressed that the Committee should strive to implement its mandate in accordance with ECOSOC resolution 1996/31, including organizing consultations with NGOs in consultative status with ECOSOC. He noted however that the implementation of the consultations should not overburden the NGO Branch or negatively affect the Committee's principal function of considering applications for consultative status. He further emphasized that the modalities of the consultations are based on the principles of equity, transparency, and fairness. He cautioned members of the Committee against taking actions that undermine its role and competence and stressed that the review of applications should be done on a caseby-case basis. In that regard, he stated that the practice of bypassing the Committee's usual review process by tabling resolutions to selectively grant certain organizations consultative status is counterproductive and contrary to the Committee's mandate.

He noted that in the most recent example, the majority of Committee members had voted against recommending consultative status on all individual applications that were put to a vote and that some Committee members had also criticised the practice of bypassing the Committee's review process. While recognizing the right of each Committee member to put applications to a vote, he expressed his delegation's objection to the singling out of specific NGO applications for a vote in a selective manner based on artificially crafted criteria and asserted that the practice was detrimental to other NGOs awaiting the Committee's decisions.

42. The representative of Pakistan expressed her delegation's support to the work of the Committee, in accordance with the ECOSOC resolution 1996/31. She stated that the NGOs make important contributions to all societies, communities, and the world at large and affirmed her delegation's support to their constructive engagement with the United Nations.

43. The representative of the United States affirmed his delegation's commitment to the promotion of meaningful participation of non-governmental organizations in the United Nations system regardless of their political beliefs. He stressed that providing a platform for the participation of diverse NGOs in the UN system makes the institution and its member states stronger and more responsive to their constituents.

44. He expressed regret regarding the continued misuse of the practice of "no objection basis" by some members of the Committee and the politicization of Committee. He further stated that his delegation would not refrain from taking action when legitimate NGOs are punished for seeking to hold governments accountable. In that regard, he recalled that his delegation in and several partners presented a group of organizations, whose applications had been deferred by the Committee for a long time for politically reasons, for a vote before Economic and Social Council in December 2022 and welcomed the decision by ECOSOC to grant accreditation to the organizations. He noted that the approved organizations presented a small number the many legitimate organizations deferred by the Committee for many years. He expressed his delegation's concern regarding the increasing number of deferred applications, in particular, those of NGOs working on issues of human rights, marginalized groups, and drug policy. He welcomed the consultations of the Committee with NGOs in consultative status, convened in 2022 and stated that his delegation would continue to advocate for the Committee hold regular consultations as mandated by resolution 1996/31.

45. The representative of Georgia noted the important role played by of NGOs in the UN's work from its inception and their crucial role in the implementation of UN decisions, human rights protection as well as the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals. He affirmed his delegation's support for the active engagement of the NGOs across the UN system, noting that their work serves to uphold the UN Charter. He further underlined the key role of civil society in the implementation of agreed frameworks, including the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Sustainable Development Goals, the Paris Agreement and human rights treaties. He affirmed his delegation's readiness as a new member of the Committee to facilitate the participation of NGOs in the work of the United Nations and to deepen the cooperation between the United Nations and civil society.

46. The representative of China affirmed his delegation's commitment to multilateralism and the important contributions of NGOs to the work of the United Nations. He stated that his delegation consistently upholds the principles of professionalism and impartiality and affirmed his support for the participation of NGOs in the work of the UN in an orderly manner in line with ECOSOC resolution 1996/31.

47. He stressed that members of the Committee should respect the working methods and established procedures of the Committee, in line ECOSOC resolution 1996/31 in order to maintain its authority. In that regard, he stated that actions aimed at disrupting or overturning the collective decisions of the Committee, undermine its authority and disrespect the UN's working methods. He further stressed that the Committee should fulfil its duties as mandated in a responsible manner. In that context, he stressed the Committee should examine all applications to ensure that they are compliant with the relevant provisions of the resolution and treat all organizations equally with fairness and impartiality. He expressed his delegation's objection to the utilization of NGOs as a pretext to attack and discredit other members and stated that it impedes the effective participation of NGOs in the UN's work. He further stated that the Committee should adhere to the principal of extensive consultations and work in the spirit of consensus in all matters including the review and improvement of its working methods and procedures. In that regard, he stressed that any reform of the Committee's working methods should be based on broad consensus among all members in accordance with the rules of procedures and established working procedures of the UN. He commended the Secretariat for overcoming the challenges related to its increased workload and limited resources and for effectively supporting the Committee to fulfil its mandate. He noted that there are over 6000 NGOs in consultative status which demonstrates the efficiency of the Committee and feasibility of its working methods. He reaffirmed his delegation's commitment to upholding the authority of the Committee, the centrality of the UN, as well as multilateralism and to the creation of better conditions for NGO participation at the UN.

48. The representative of Zimbabwe welcomed the efforts of member states to create space for the active participation of NGOs in the programmes and activities of the United Nations and underlined their invaluable contribution in the implementation of development priorities. He highlighted the increase in the number of NGOs seeking consultative status with ECOSOC and stressed that the Committee has the responsibility to facilitate their participation in accordance with relevant UN resolutions governing their participation. He reaffirmed his delegation's readiness to collaborate with all members to deliver the mandate of the Committee through cooperation and mutual understanding and commitment to maintaining the credibility and integrity of the Committee.

49. The representative of the European Union, in its capacity as observer, also on behalf of Albania, Georgia, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Montenegro, North Macedonia, the Republic of Moldova and Ukraine expressed hope that the new members of the Committee would contribute to fulfilling its mandate and overcome its challenges and shortcomings, in particular by rejecting the practice of the unjustified deferral of some NGOs, sometimes for many years, on the basis of dilatory arguments and repeated questioning of NGOs, in contravention to the spirit of Resolution 1996/31. He stressed that the Committee has a high responsibility to uphold the credibility of the UN. He stated that the reform of the Committee was needed in order to allow for its more inclusive, effective, fair and transparent functioning, including through limits to deferrals and a process to reconsider arbitrary or erroneous decisions on deferral or denial. He pointed out that many NGOs applications had been deferred for many years, despite having provided detailed responses to the Committee's questions in good faith and urged the Committee to stop the practice of asking irrelevant or repetitive questions.

50. The representative recalled that the Economic and Social Council had voted to grant special consultative status to a number of non-governmental organisations in 2022 and reversed the Committee's recommendations. He stated that that the Economic and Social Council has the final decision-making authority on the granting consultative status and that it had exercised its authority appropriately when the

Committee failed to fulfil its mandate. He further stated that there was no justification to further delay consideration of applications that had been pending for a very long time. In that regard, he cited as examples the applications of the organizations, Secours Islamique France, deferred since 2018, the Hellenic Institute of Cultural Diplomacy and the Panhellenic Union of Cappadocian Associations, Associazione Luca Coscioni, the Robert Bosch Stiftung Gesellschaft mit beschränkter Haftung, and Terre Des Femmes - Menschenrechte fuer die Frau e.V. and urged the Committee to recommend them for consultative status. He further reiterated his appeal to the Committee to allow NGOs to intervene virtually during the daily question-andanswer segments of its sessions.

51. In her closing remarks, at the 15th meeting, on 1 February, the Vice-Chair commended the Committee for its work and noted that the 2023 regular session had incorporated improvements in the Committee's working methods. In that regard, she noted that the Committee had implemented its decision made at the 2022 regular session, to establish a deadline of two business days (48 hours) before the beginning of each session for the receipt of responses provided by NGOs to its questions, to afford the Committee adequate time to review and consider those responses.

52. The representative of Türkiye commended the Chair for the successful completion of the Committee's program of work. He noted that there was a need for the Committee to review some of its working methods in particular those pertaining to the conduct of the second round of review of applications in cases where responses to the questions of the Committee have been received from non-governmental organizations during the session. He maintained that the Committee should establish clear deadlines and time frames in which the responses received from non-governmental organizations during the session of the Committee will be accepted and reviewed by the Committee. He further stated that the deadlines should be established in a way that would ensure the fair and transparent review of NGO applications, while not overburdening the Secretariat as well as the individual Committee members who need adequate time to review each application and the responses received in a timely manner. He stated that his delegation would engage actively in the deliberations with a view to achieving a constructive solution through consensus.

53. The representative of China also commended the Chair for the effective steering of the session. He noted that the Committee had deliberated on its working methods during the session and expressed his delegation's readiness to engage in informal deliberations with the goal of enhancing the NGO Committee's working methods including regarding how Committee deals with the responses received from the NGOs in a predictable and orderly manner.

54. The representative of Cuba stated that there was a need to for the Committee to use its time more efficiently given the limited resources. He concurred with the proposals made by the representatives of Türkiye and China that there was a need to explore feasible solutions in an informal setting, to allow the Committee adequate time to review the detailed responses received from non-governmental organizations during the session. He reiterated his delegation's previous request for the Secretariat to provide training to members of the Committee to familiarise them on the use of the new platform before its official roll out.

55. The representative of China also concurred with the proposals made by the representatives of Türkiye, China and Cuba regarding the establishment of a timeframe for the Committee's review of the responses received from non-governmental organizations during the session. He stated that there was a need for the Committee to hold informal consultations to discuss it working methods including how to streamline the participation of non-governmental organizations during the

question-and-answer sessions and the allocation of time for the second round of review applications with a view to improving the Committee's methods of work.

56. The Vice-Chair of the Committee took note of the proposals made by the various representatives and stated that she would convene informal consultations to address the issues raised by the members of the Committee during the inter-sessional period.

B. Attendance

57. The session was attended by 18 members of the Committee. Observers for other States Members of the United Nations, observers for non-member States and representatives of organizations of the United Nations system and NGOs also attended. The list of participants will be issued in document E/C.2/2023/INF/1.

58. At its 2023 regular session, the Committee heard 7representatives of NGOs, who were given the opportunity to respond to questions raised by the Committee. The additional information provided by the representatives facilitated the debate and the work of the Committee in taking its decisions.

59. At its 8th meeting on 26 January the Committee listened to the observer of Indonesia presenting a request of the government of Indonesia to the Committee to revisit its decisions to recommend consultative status to Nationaal Papoea Vereniging '95/West Nieuw Guinea and West Papua Interest Association, stating that the applications of these NGOs do not meet the fundamental requirement for NGO participation in the UN system. At the same meeting the Committee decided to reconsider the applications of the two NGOs.

C. Election of officers

60. At its 1st meeting, on 23 January, the Committee elected Petronellar Nyagura (Zimbabwe) as Vice-Chair of the Committee.

61. At its 15th meeting, on 13 February, the Committee elected Daniel Zavala Porras (Costa Rica) as Vice-Chair of the Committee.

D. Agenda

62. At its 1st meeting, on 23 January, the Committee approved the provisional agenda for its 2023 session, as contained in document E/C.2/2023/1. The agenda reads as follows:

- 1. Election of officers.
- 2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters.
- 3. Applications for consultative status with the Council and requests for reclassification received from non-governmental organizations:

VIII. Adoption of the report of the Committee on its 2023 regular session

63. At its 14th meeting, on 1 February, the Committee took note of the draft report and authorized the Rapporteur to finalize the report with the support of the Secretariat and in consultation with the members of the Committee, as appropriate, with a view to its submission to the Economic and Social Council for appropriate action.

64. At its 15th meeting, on 13 February, the Committee adopted the present report.
