Committee of Experts on International Cooperation in Tax Matters

At its 9th plenary meeting, on 16 February 2022, the Economic and Social Council, taking into account the continuing impact of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) on the working arrangements for the sessions of the Council and of its subsidiary bodies:

- (a) Decided that, if feasible, the twenty-fourth session of the Committee of Experts on International Cooperation in Tax Matters shall be held from 4 to 7 April 2022, in New York, and otherwise shall be held in informal meetings in a scaled-down format using a virtual platform in April 2022, with the decisions of the Committee adopted through a silence procedure and the final modalities decided by the Co-Chairs of the Committee following consultations with the members of the Committee;
- (b) Approved the provisional agenda of the twenty-fourth session of the Committee, as proposed by the Committee of Experts and as set out below:

 - (m) Wealth and solidarity taxes;
 - (n) Indirect taxes,
 - (o) Health taxes;
 - (p) Relationship of tax, trade and investment agreements;
 - (q) Capacity-building;
 - (r) Other matters for consideration.
