Welcome to this survey on progress in implementing UN General Assembly resolutions 71/243 and 67/226 on the Quadrennial Comprehensive Policy Review (QCPR) of UN operational activities for development.

This is the fourth survey of Resident Coordinators, which enables Resident Coordinators and UNCTs to provide feedback on the implementation of the QCPR resolutions at country level. The results of the survey will be included in the next annual Secretary-General report on Operational Activities for Development.

The respondents to the survey are UN Resident Coordinators. Resident Coordinators are expected to consult with UNCT members on relevant questions. Please note that only one survey response can be accepted per Resident Coordinator. Please be sure to submit the official response online. The software allows the questionnaire to be saved and reopened at a later stage on the same computer.

The survey is set out in three broad categories: relevance, effectiveness and efficiency.

Responses and comments will be treated in strict confidence and will remain anonymous. Your identity will remain confidential and your answers will only be amalgamated by groups of countries. The reporting will not contain any data or statement from which a reader can identify the source of any answers or comments.

In this questionnaire, the term 'UN entities' is used as shorthand for UN Specialized Agencies, UN Funds and Programmes, and Departments of the UN Secretariat that are carrying out operational activities for development.

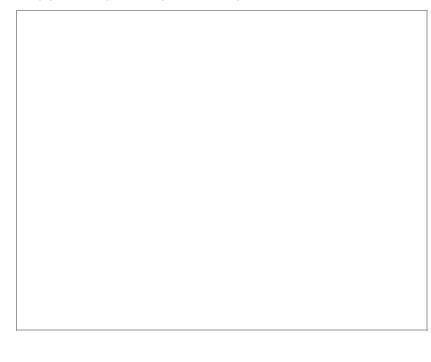
