Special Meeting of the Economic and Social Council on "Innovations for Infrastructure Development and Promoting Sustainable Industrialisation"

From my perspective, a key message that has been reinforced is the importance of keeping people at the centre of our discussion of SDG 9. Ultimately, our objective should be to build societies where everyone can thrive, aided by infrastructure, industrialisation and innovation.

In many developing countries where the potential of industrialisation looms large, advances in science, technology and innovation in sectors -- such as agriculture -- have the potential to promote employment and income growth.

Developing key infrastructure will also catalyse the achievement of the entire 2030 Agenda and help to bolster people's abilities to meet their basic needs and fully participate in society.

In these ways, infrastructure, industrialisation and innovation also have critical roles to play in ensuring social inclusion, including of the poorest and most disadvantaged groups.

Although there is broad agreement that infrastructure, industrialisation and innovation are essential for poverty eradication and sustainable development, ongoing gaps in investment, capacities and policy frameworks hold back progress.

We know the scale of the challenge, and this initiative has helped us to highlight some of the key challenges and bottlenecks. The 2030 Agenda provides a roadmap for addressing these challenges, complemented by the Addis Ababa Action Agenda, which provides a framework for overcoming obstacles to investments in infrastructure and capacity-building.

Progress will also be made through the various partnerships and frameworks formed in response to these challenges, including through such concrete initiatives as the Programme for Country Partnership (PCP) and 3ADI+.

I look forward to continued engagement with these two exciting initiatives and am confident that they will achieve great things as they are strengthened and scaled up.
