## **2021 Government Survey** on UN operational activities for development

Welcome to this survey on UN development cooperation, requested by the UN General Assembly.

The aim of the survey is to give all countries an opportunity to provide feedback on the performance of the UN development system in support of their effort to implement the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The survey addresses the follow-up to the provisions of the General Assembly resolutions on UN development system operational activities, notably the GA resolution on the Ouadrennial Comprehensive Policy Review (OCPR) and the GA resolution on the repositioning of the UN development system. The survey results will serve as an important input to the work of the UN Economic and Social Council which oversees the UN system implementation of the quadrennial comprehensive policy review and the continued effectiveness, efficiency and relevance of UN operational activities for development.

This year, the survey is composed of two parts:

- The first part is directed at programme country Governments, which have a UN resident coordinator office in their country, or are served by one through a multi-country office arrangement;
- The second part is directed at Governments that provide voluntary financial resources to the UN development system.

Governments that are both programme country Governments and contribute financially to the operational activities for development of the UN are kindly asked to fill out both parts of the survey.

The survey is to be completed by senior government officials responsible for - or closely associated with - UN operational activities for development. We encourage you to consult with relevant colleagues across government who engage with UN entities. A Word copy of the online survey is attached in the email with the survey link, and can be shared to support these consultations. Please note, however, that the Word version of the survey is for reference only.

Please be sure to submit your country's official response online. The survey software can allow the questionnaire to be saved and reopened at a later stage, using the same device and web browser. Only one questionnaire may be completed per programme country.
