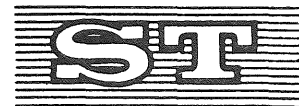

Report of the Secretary-General

DRAFT CLASSIFICATION BY BROAD ECONOMIC CATEGORIES

I. INTRODUCTION

1. In the report of the thirteenth session (E/4045, para. 30), the United Nations Statistical Commission recommended that data on large economic classes of commodities of imports and exports distinguishing food, industrial supplies, capital equipment, consumer non-durables and consumer durables should be compiled for each reporting country and for the world and principal regions to supplement the summary data already compiled on the basis of the Standard International Trade Classification sections.
2. In compliance with this recommendation, the Statistical Office of the United Nations prepared the draft classification by Broad Economic Categories (BEC) (E/CN.3/341) in which 15 categories of commodities were introduced. These categories were designed not only to satisfy the requirement for the five large economic classes of commodities recommended by the Statistical Commission, but also to give aggregates reflecting the approximate degree of manufacture (primary, semi-finished and finished) as well as the basic divisions of consumption, intermediate and capital goods.
3. The draft classification (BEC) was submitted to the fourteenth session of the Statistical Commission which was held in October 1966 in Geneva. In paragraph 34 of its report of the session (E/4283), the Commission stated that:
"..... two categories offered particular problems. Fuel, power and lubricants disappear in the course of production, are thus difficult to allocate and are often shown as a separate category. Transportation equipment is difficult to allocate as between capital and consumption, especially, in the case of exports and is also often shown as a separate category. Special attention should be given to the category of capital goods, which was a category of great significance for analytical purposes."
In paragraph 35, it further stated:
"The Commission felt that the Secretariat should continue its work on this subject. Certain experimentation would be possible on the basis of the material in the data bank on world trade. The

classification should be revised in the light of the views expressed by the Commission and then circulated to countries for comment. The Secretariat was requested to present a revised classification for consideration by the Commission at its fifteenth session, together with a summary of the comments of countries."

4. Complying with the recommendation stated above, the Statistical Office of the United Nations has prepared the revised draft classification by Broad Economic Categories (BEC) set out below:

Annex I to this document contains for each category of the revised BEC its composition in terms of the Standard International Trade Classification, Revised (SITC, Revised). The SITC, Revised, is used to define the content of the BEC as most countries (about 110) compile their trade statistics for international use in essentially the full detail (5-digit level) of the SITC, Revised. This is also true of those countries which use for customs tariff purposes the Brussels Tariff Nomenclature with which the SITC is compatible.

II. Purpose of BEC

5. The BEC is devised mainly for use by the Statistical Office of the United Nations. It is not intended to request governments to provide aggregates of their trade statistics on this classification (see paragraph 21 below).

6. The BEC is designed to serve as a conversion of the data compiled on the Standard International Trade Classification, (SITC), Revised, to meaningful aggregates for purposes of economic analysis of the uses to which goods are put, based on the concepts of the System of National Accounts (SNA). In studying national economic problems and/or similar problems of the world or a region, external trade statistics, being an important component of general economic statistics, have to be considered jointly with other components such as various elements of national accounts, industrial statistics, etc.. It follows, therefore, that it is necessary to have a common basis for classifying the various aspects of general economic statistics, including external trade statistics. The draft BEC is an attempt to devise a classification of external trade statistics for this purpose.

7. It is not possible to formulate a classification of external trade statistics that will be in complete alignment with the uses to which commodities are, in fact, put, chiefly because many commodities recorded in external trade statistics may be put to various uses. Moreover, the SITC was not designed to facilitate analysis by end use. It is, however, believed that the draft BEC, consisting of the 19 categories listed in paragraph 4, will prove to be a satisfactory approximation for the purpose of general economic analysis.

III. Description of categories

8. In order to provide elements in the BEC which will enable users to obtain aggregates comparable to those for the three basic classes in the SNA: consumption goods, intermediate goods and capital goods, it is necessary to introduce a number of sub-categories to supplement the main categories that the Statistical Commission had originally requested (see paragraphs 1 and 3). The composition of the sub-categories are outlined in the following paragraphs.

9. Primary commodities are usually products of extractive industries and of farms, forestry, fishing or hunting. When dealing with internationally traded products, it is necessary to consider the magnitudes of the contributions of the various sectors of the economy to the value of the product. Primary commodities, although they may have undergone some transformation, derive almost all their value from the primary sector of the economy rather than from another sector where the product underwent a minor change. For example, cotton undergoes physical transformation when ginned, but as almost all the value of ginned cotton derives from the agricultural sector, it is normally classified as a primary commodity, not as a product of the textile industry in which cotton ginning is included (see ISIC).^{1/} Canned and prepared foods, on the other hand, owe much of their value to the food-processing industry and are generally excluded from the primary classification. It, therefore, appears desirable to

adhere to the principle that a commodity is classified as primary if it is a product of farm, forest, fishing and hunting, or of an extractive industry, to whose value transformation has made only a very minor contribution. Waste and scrap materials are also classified as primary commodities in the BEC.

10. If a commodity is not defined as primary, it is classified as processed.

11. Many of the foods in BEC Category I "Food and Beverages" belong to the class "Intermediate Goods" in the SNA. For instance, wheat is supplied to the milling industry to produce flour, and flour, in turn, is supplied to bakeries to produce bread. Therefore, in the SNA, both wheat and flour may be considered as intermediate goods for the food industry. Tea is destined for household consumption, as is processed canned food. Consequently, it is necessary to have four sub-categories for Category I so that both primary and processed foods and beverages can be differentiated between intermediate goods for the food industry and those for final consumption by households.

12. For similar reasons to those stated in the foregoing paragraph on food and beverages, Category III (Fuels and lubricants) is also divided into four sub-categories in order to differentiate primary and processed fuels for household consumption (e.g., anthracite, briquettes of coal, etc.) from those used by industry.

13. Machinery, etc. and accessories thereof (Category IV) are manufactured goods, generally with a useful life of more than one year. In this category, machinery such as electrical generators and computers and other manufactured goods such as medical furniture are used by industry, government and non-profit private institutions. They are, in fact, producers' goods that are defined in the SNA as part of fixed capital formation. On the other hand, parts and accessories essential to the maintenance of machinery and un-assembled components of machinery etc. used as supplies to assembling plants are, in fact, inputs to industry and are, for this reason, considered as intermediate goods in the SNA. Consequently, Category IV is divided into two sub-categories in which commodities are aggregated according to whether they are used as fixed capital formation or intermediate goods.

14. Transport equipment covers finished ships, road vehicles, whether motorized or not, aircraft, railway and tramway rolling stock plus their parts and other accessories. In the SNA, these finished commodities are either classified as fixed capital formation or as household final consumption goods (durable consumer goods such as household passenger cars), while parts and accessories are treated as intermediate goods. Most of the transport equipment traded internationally is classified as fixed capital formation and is therefore defined as "capital goods". There are, however, substantial amounts of this category such as bicycles and passenger motor vehicles which are defined as durable consumer goods. Consequently, Category V has three sub-categories into which capital goods, intermediate goods and durable consumer goods may be placed.

15. Non-durable consumer goods (except food and fuels) are commodities with a useful life of one year or less which are primarily used by households. In addition, goods of a relatively low value with a useful life of more than one year but less than three years are also classified as non-durable consumer goods. Durable goods are defined as commodities with a useful life of three or more years as well as those of relatively high value with a life of between one and three years.

16. Arms and ammunition are classified as processed goods not elsewhere specified.

17. Numerous individual commodities classified in the SITC, Revised, have several uses in terms of the SNA. For instance, petroleum products, while mainly consumed by industry, are also important commodities for household consumers. If these anomalies remain unadjusted, the distortion in the end use pattern may be very serious. To alleviate a considerable part of this incompatibility between the BEC and the SNA, the Statistical Office of the United Nations feels it necessary to estimate the proportions destined for the different broad economic categories for twenty-six important internationally traded commodities. These commodities are shown in Annex II; and are also listed among other commodities in their respective categories in Annex I where they are denoted by an asterisk for easy reference.

18. At present, the proportion of the commodity totals attributable to each end use is generally not known, and considerable effort may have to be expended before they can be precisely determined. It is, however, the opinion of the Statistical Office of the United Nations, that, if meaningful aggregates of external trade statistics by end use are to be undertaken, these proportions must be estimated even if the resultant figures are only approximate. Research has shown that approximate estimates with inordinately large margins of error compare favourably with cases where these commodities are not split at all. For this reason, the Statistical Office of the United Nations would be grateful if national statistical offices would be willing to supply, once a year, the estimated proportions destined to each of the specified categories shown in Annex II for their imports of the twenty-six commodities. These data will enable the Statistical Office to arrive at a more realistic set of factors to be applied to the trade data of individual countries as well as to regional and global totals. Such a refinement will substantially improve the usefulness of the data.

19. In the case of relatively less important commodities, these are listed only under the heading which represents the major use made of those commodities traded internationally. In the case of fresh grapes, for instance, the bulk is used as an input by the wine-making industry, but those entering international trade, which necessitate elaborate refrigeration equipment for their transportation are mainly destined for retail sale and are, thus, classified as primary food for household consumption rather than as a supply to the beverage industry.

20. It is possible to re-arrange the 19 categories of the BEC to arrive at aggregates for capital goods, which the Statistical Commission stressed (see paragraph 3 above) together with intermediate goods and consumption goods; a classification fundamental in the concept of the SNA:

1. Capital goods

IV. General Remarks

21. It is proposed that in order to facilitate international comparison by end use, the 19 categories and the three derived classes of the BEC - capital goods, intermediate goods and consumption goods - be recognized internationally as a useful classification for all commodities traded internationally. They are not intended to interfere with or supersede a classification that is more compatible with the internal statistical system of any country. In fact, it is not necessary for a government to supply its trade data in terms of the BEC since such data can easily be derived by computer from data classified according to the SITC, Revised, or the BTN which are currently being supplied to the Statistical Office of the United Nations by the majority of countries.

22. Should national governments and the Statistical Commission think it worthwhile, it is the intention of the Statistical Office of the United Nations to publish aggregates of the 19 categories and the three derived classes of the BEC at regular intervals in Commodity Trade Statistics. Eventually, world aggregates in matrix form may be attempted.

23. Although the BEC is mainly meant for imports, it will also be useful to present export data on this classification.

24. During the past years, the Statistical Office of the United Nations has conducted pilot studies into the possibility of analysing exports by origin from different economic sectors of the exporting countries. If successful, this would mean that commodity trade could be traced from economic sector of origin to ultimate consumption by end use. Such a development would make a novel and highly significant contribution to general economic analysis. The results of the Statistical Office pilot studies suggest that this analysis may be feasible, and with rapid advances being made in various countries on input-output studies, it is hoped that within the next five years, world exports may perhaps be analysed in terms of value added by different sectors of the economy. Therefore, the introduction of the BEC can only be considered as a first step towards a comprehensive statistical analysis of external trade which must be followed by the second step, namely tracing exports from their sector of origin.
