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EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS

DRAFT CLASSIFICATION BY BROAD ECONOMIC CATEGORIES

Report of the Secretary-General

I. INTRODUCTION

1. In the report of the thirteenth session (E/4045, para. 30), the Statistical Commission recommended that data on large economic classes of commodities of imports and exports, distinguishing food, industrial supplies, capital equipment, consumer non-durables and consumer durables, should be compiled for each reporting country and for the world and principal regions to supplement the summary data already compiled on the basis of the sections of the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC).

2. In compliance with this recommendation, the Statistical Office of the United Nations prepared a draft "Classification by Broad Economic Categories" (BEC) (E/CN.3/341), which was submitted to the fourteenth session of the Commission. In its report of the session (E/4283, para. 34), the Commission stated that:

"..... Two categories offered particular problems. Fuel, power and lubricants disappear in the course of production, are thus difficult to allocate and are often shown as a separate category. Transportation equipment is difficult to allocate as between capital and consumption, especially in the case of exports and is also often shown as a separate category. Special attention should be given to the category of capital goods, which was a category of great significance for analytical purposes."

In paragraph 35, it further stated:

" The Commission felt that the Secretariat should continue its work on this subject. Certain experimentation would be possible on the basis of the material in the data bank on world trade. The classification should be revised in the light of the views expressed by the Commission and then circulated to countries for comment. The Secretariat was requested to present a revised classification for consideration by the Commission at its fifteenth session, together with a summary of the comments of countries."

3. In accordance with the Commission's request the Statistical Office of the United Nations prepared a revised classification by Broad Economic Categories (BEC) which, as document ST/STAT/18, was circulated, prior to the fifteenth session of the Commission, to selected countries and international organizations for comments. The revised draft BEC was comprised of nineteen categories which were devised so as to take account of the following criteria:

- (i) the need to distinguish the five categories specified by the Commission at its thirteenth session;
- (ii) provision of separate categories for "fuels and lubricants" and "transport equipment" in pursuance of the Commission's discussions at its fourteenth session;
- (iii) within the categories relating to capital equipment - a distinction between equipment proper and parts and accessories;
- (iv) within the respective categories for "Food and beverages", "Industrial supplies (non-food)" and "Fuels and lubricants" (and also within the residual category "Goods not elsewhere specified") - a distinction between "primary" commodities and "processed" commodities;
- (v) within the respective categories for "Primary food and beverages", "Processed food and beverages", "Primary fuels and lubricants", "Processed fuels and lubricants", and "Transport equipment" (other than parts and accessories) - a distinction between commodities for industry and those for household consumption.

4. These nineteen categories were designed to meet not only the comments made by the Commission itself, by individual countries and by international organizations, but also to provide elements in the BEC which would enable users to obtain aggregates as comparable as possible with those for the three basic classes in the System of National Accounts (SNA): capital goods, intermediate goods and consumption goods.

Each category of the revised draft BEC was defined in terms of divisions, groups, sub-groups and items of the Standard International Trade Classification, Revised (SITC, Revised).

5. The revised draft BEC (E/CN.3/382) was presented to the fifteenth session of the Commission together with a summary of comments (E/CN.3/382/Add.1) received from selected countries and international organizations. In its report of the session (E/4471, para. 117 and 118), the Commission stated:

"The Commission agreed that the document before it was an improvement on the draft presented to the Commission's fourteenth session (E/CN.3/341). It was pleased to see the inclusion in the revised draft of separate categories at the broadest level for 'fuels and lubricants' and 'transport equipment', and the elimination of certain subdivisions made at lower levels in the previous draft.

"The Commission expressed the view that a classification of the BEC type would be useful for national purposes as well as for international institutions. It agreed that an end-use classification could be useful if practicable and if linked to the SNA. It noted the value of the BEC in representing a basis for the statistician to go as far as is practicable in meeting the needs nationally and internationally of economists for categories required for economic analysis."

6. The Commission, however, expressed serious reservations about three aspects of the revised draft BEC, namely:

- (i) the allocation of dual-use commodities to more than one end-use category (para. 119 of the Commission's report);
- (ii) the definitions of durable and non-durable consumer goods (para. 120);
- (iii) the method of publication of data based on the BEC; in view of the fact that, even if the double allocation of dual-use commodities were eliminated, there would still be a considerable conventional element in the allocations proposed in the draft BEC, the Commission felt that such data, instead of being incorporated in "Commodity Trade Statistics", should be published separately with the proper technical notes (para. 121).

7. In paragraph 123, the Commission further expressed the view that:

"..... once an international BEC is established, national classifications of this type will inevitably be attracted towards it and it will eventually tend to serve as a guideline and ultimately as a standard with wide use. Further study and consultation was, therefore, essential before a final BEC classification is adopted."

8. In the light of the comments of the Commission and those made by countries and international organizations, the Statistical Office of the United Nations has

prepared the revised classification by Broad Economic Categories (BEC) set out below:

9. The revised draft BEC which is here presented for the consideration of the Commission is comprised of nineteen categories. The full draft classification and its composition in terms of the headings of the SITC, Revised are set out in the annex to this paper. In accordance with comments received by the Statistical Office,

the numbering system used in the earlier draft classifications has been replaced by a decimal number system and the subdivisions previously shown within the residual category "Goods not elsewhere specified" have been eliminated.

10. The revised classification requires that each of the twenty-six SITC headings which were previously allocated to more than one BEC category, now be allocated entirely to one BEC category. This was done by including special categories (321 Motor spirit and 51 Passenger motor vehicles) in the BEC structure for two selected dual-use commodities of major importance in international trade and by providing for each of the other twenty-four dual-use commodities to be allocated uniquely to one BEC category according to its major end-use.

11. As a consequence of the basis of allocation referred to in the previous paragraph, the contents of the categories "Primary fuels and lubricants for household consumption" and "Processed fuels and lubricants for household consumption" were diminished to the point where it seemed that retention of these categories in the BEC would not be worthwhile. Therefore, in the newly revised BEC, these categories have not been shown separately (as in the previous draft BEC) but have been combined with categories covering fuels and lubricants for industry to form categories "31 Primary fuels and lubricants" and "322 Processed fuels and lubricants" (other than motor spirit), respectively, at the most detailed level of the classification.

12. Consumer goods in the revised BEC are divided into three sub-categories: durable, semi-durable and non-durable (as against two in the previous draft). As a consequence of this change, certain SITC headings formerly classified as "durable" or "non-durable" are now listed as "semi-durable".

## II. PURPOSE OF THE BEC

13. The BEC was originally devised mainly for use by the Statistical Office, but in view of the Commission's comment in para. 123 of its report of the fifteenth session (see para. 7 above), it is clear that a further purpose of the BEC is to develop an international standard classification to serve as a guideline for national classifications of imports and exports according to broad economic categories.

14. The BEC is designed to serve as a means for converting data compiled on the SITC, Revised, which as it stands is not entirely suitable for analysis by end-use, to meaningful aggregates for purposes of economic analysis of the uses to which goods are put, based on the SNA concepts. In studying national economic

problems and/or similar problems of the world, or of a region, external trade statistics, being an important component of general economic statistics, have to be considered jointly with other components such as various elements of national accounts, industrial statistics, etc. It follows, therefore, that it is necessary to have a common basis for classifying the various aspects of general economic statistics, including external trade statistics. The present draft BEC is an attempt to devise a classification of external trade statistics for this purpose.

15. It is not possible to formulate a classification of external trade statistics that will be in complete alignment with the particular end-use to which articles are put in specific instances, chiefly because many commodities recorded in external trade statistics may be put to various uses. Accordingly, commodities are, in general, allocated to the categories of the BEC on the basis of their main end-use. Subject to this limitation, an important objective of the BEC is to provide categories which as far as practicable can be aligned with the basic classes of the SNA: capital goods, intermediate goods and consumer goods.

### III. DESCRIPTION OF THE CATEGORIES

16. In order to provide elements in the BEC which will enable users to obtain aggregates approximately comparable to those for the three basic classes of the SNA, it is necessary to include in the BEC a number of sub-categories to supplement the main categories originally requested by the Commission (see paras 1 and 2). The composition of these sub-categories is outlined in the following paragraphs.

17. In general, commodities which have been classified as "primary" are those which characteristically are products of primary sectors of the economy - i.e., farming, forestry, fishing, hunting, and the extractive industries. However, commodities which characteristically are products of other sectors, such as manufacturing, where the product underwent a minor change, are classified as "primary" in cases where nearly all the value of the product is contributed by one of the primary sectors of the economy. For example, cotton undergoes physical transformation when ginned, but as almost all the value of ginned cotton derives from the agricultural sector, it is classified, in the BEC, as a primary commodity, not as a product of the textile industry in which cotton ginning is included (see ISIC <sup>1/</sup>). Canned and prepared foods, on the other hand, owe much of their

value to the food-processing industry and are generally excluded from the primary category. Thus, a commodity is classified as "primary" if it is a product of farm, forest, fishing and hunting, or of an extractive industry, to whose value transformation has made only a very minor contribution. Waste and scrap materials are also classified as primary commodities in the BEC.

18. If a commodity is not defined as primary, it is classified as processed.

19. The main or usual end-use of many of the food items in BEC category 1 Food and beverages is household consumption, while many other food items belong to the class "intermediate goods" in the SNA. For instance, tea is mainly used for household consumption, as are processed canned foods. Wheat, however, is commonly supplied to the milling industry to produce flour, and flour, in turn, is commonly supplied to bakeries to produce bread; therefore, both wheat and flour may be considered as intermediate goods for the food industry. Accordingly, in order to facilitate analysis in terms of the three SNA classes, it is necessary to sub-divide category 11 Primary food and beverages and category 12 Processed food and beverages to provide for commodities "for industry" and "for household consumption". The situation is, however, made complex by the fact that many food items may in some particular instances be used for industry, and in other instances for household consumption. Indeed, in category 11 the great majority of items are capable of dual-use, and the only practicable way of making the dissection between the SNA classes in this category is on a conventional basis. Thus, for example, the conventions are adopted that food-grains, when traded internationally, are normally for use by industry, and that fresh fruit and vegetables, when traded internationally, are normally for household consumption. In the case of category 12, the majority of items can be allocated between the SNA classes with greater certainty, but a considerable conventional element is nevertheless involved in the case of several commodities.

20. Because of the importance of trade in motor spirit, and because this commodity is commonly used both by industry and by consumers, a separate category (category 321), which is not allocated to a specific SNA class, has been established in the BEC.

21. Machinery, other capital equipment (except transport) and accessories thereof (category 4) is divided into two sub-categories in which commodities are classified according to whether their main end-use is as capital goods (machinery and other capital equipment) or as intermediate goods (parts and accessories).

In this category, machinery, such as electrical generators and computers, and other manufactured goods, such as medical furniture, are used by industry, government and non-profit private institutions. They are, in fact, producers' goods that are defined in the SNA as part of fixed capital formation. On the other hand, parts and accessories essential to the maintenance of machinery, and unassembled components of machinery, etc. used as supplies to assembling plants are, in fact, inputs to industry and are, for this reason, considered as intermediate goods.

22. Transport equipment covers finished ships, road vehicles, whether motorized or not, aircraft, railway and tramway rolling stock plus their parts and other accessories. In the SNA, the finished commodities are either classified as capital goods or as (durable) consumer goods, while parts and accessories are treated as intermediate goods. Most of the transport equipment traded internationally is classified as capital goods, and is therefore treated in the BEC as "industrial". However, several items, such as motorcycles and bicycles, are normally used by consumers and hence are classified as "non-industrial" transport equipment. An especially difficult problem is encountered in the case of passenger motor cars, which are particularly important in international trade, but which are commonly used either as capital goods or as durable consumer goods. To meet this problem a separate category (category 51), which is not allocated to a specific SNA class, has been established in the BEC.

23. Durable consumer goods are defined as commodities which have an expected life-time of more than one year and a relatively high value, such as refrigerators and washing machines, together with other commodities with a useful life of three years or more; semi-durable consumer goods are those which have an expected life-time of use of more than one year but less than three years and are not of relatively high value; and non-durable consumer goods are those with an expected life-time of one year or less.

24. Military equipment, including arms and ammunition, is classified, in general, in category 7 Goods not elsewhere specified.



25. It is possible to obtain a partial rearrangement of the nineteen categories of the BEC to arrive at approximate aggregates for the three basic SNA classes:

1. Capital goods

Sum of categories:

41 Machinery and other capital equipment (except transport)

521 Transport equipment, industrial

2. Intermediate goods

Sum of categories:

111 Food and beverages, primary, for industry

121 Food and beverages, processed, for industry

2 Industrial supplies (non-food)

31 Fuels and lubricants, primary

322 Fuels and lubricants, processed (other than motor spirit)

42 Parts and accessories for machinery and other capital equipment (except transport)

53 Parts and accessories for transport equipment

3. Consumption goods

Sum of categories:

112 Food and beverages, primary, for household consumption

122 Food and beverages, processed, for household consumption

522 Transport equipment, non-industrial

6 Consumer goods not elsewhere specified

26. Motor spirit (category 321) and passenger motor vehicles (category 51), which are used extensively both for industry and for household consumption, are of particular importance in international trade and of great interest to economists and others studying international flows of commodities. As indicated in paras. 20 and 22, these commodities warrant establishment in the BEC of separate categories, which are not allocated to specific SNA classes (see para. 25). The segregation of these two important dual-use commodities provides a starting point for users who may wish to make their own apportionment of such commodities among the basic SNA classes (in many cases, users may prefer to make their own apportionment rather than rely on a standardized allocation).

#### IV. GENERAL REMARKS

27. It is proposed that in order to facilitate international comparison by end-use, the nineteen categories and the three derived classes of the BEC - capital goods, intermediate goods and consumption goods - be recognized internationally as a useful classification for all commodities traded internationally. They are not intended to interfere with or supersede a classification that is more compatible with the internal statistical system of any country. Many countries will no doubt wish to utilize the BEC for national purposes as a supplement to existing classifications.

#### V. CONCLUSIONS

28. The Commission may wish to ask the Secretary-General to revise the BEC in the light of its discussions, and to publish the revised edition.

29. Finally, the Commission may wish to ask the Secretary-General to arrange for the Statistical Office to compile and publish statistics according to the nineteen categories and the three derived classes of the BEC at regular intervals.
