As requested by the Working Group on International Statistical Programmes and Coordination of the Statistical Commission at its meeting in February 1998, a draft of the revised *Principles and Recommendations for a Vital Statistics System* was prepared. An expert group will review the draft in New York from 16 to 20 November 1998. The report of the expert group (E/CN.3/1999/10) will be before the Commission.

In addition, activities related to conducting a population and housing census are reported. The dates for population and housing censuses of each country during the 1990 and 2000 decades are provided in the annex. Work undertaken in the area of social statistics in the area of gender statistics, human settlements and criminal justice is also reviewed in the present report.

Work on international migration statistics includes the publication of *Principles of International Migration Statistics* in English; translation into all official languages is under way.

I. Introduction

1. The Working Group on International Statistical Programmes and Coordination of the Statistical Commission, at its meeting in February 1998, requested the Statistics Division to revise the *Principles and Recommendations for a Vital Statistics System*¹ last issued in 1973. In addition to undertaking this work, the Division has undertaken a variety of activities related to implementing the 2000 World Population and Housing Census Programme² and the continued work on methodology and dissemination in the area of social statistics.

II. Civil registration and vital statistics

2. A provisional draft revision of the *Principles and Recommendations for a Vital Statistics Systems* (PROV/ST/ESA/STAT/SER.M/19/Rev.2) has been prepared, incorporating the latest developments in concepts, definitions, classifications, coding systems, and newly available technology for storage, retrieval and data processing of vital records and statistics. It will be reviewed by an expert group convened by the United Nations Statistics Division in New York from 16 to 20 November 1998. The report of the expert group (E/CN.3/1999/10), proposing any necessary revisions, will be before the Statistical Commission at its thirtieth session, together with a description of further activities required.

3. In partnership with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), the five-part series *Handbooks on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Systems* has been prepared and submitted for publication. The *Handbook on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Systems: Developing Information, Communication and Education*³ and the *Handbook on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Systems: Policies and Protocols for the Release and Archiving of Individual Records*⁴ have already been issued in English. The *Handbook on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Systems: Management, Operation and Maintenance*⁵ is scheduled for publication in December 1998; the *Handbook on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Systems: Preparation of a Legal Framework*⁶ is scheduled for publication in Spanish and English in October 1998; and the *Handbook on Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Systems: Computerization*⁷ is scheduled for publication in November 1998. The *Handbooks* will be submitted for translation into the other official languages of the United Nations during the last quarter of 1998.

4. In addition, the United Nations Statistics Division, in collaboration with UNFPA, is implementing the second phase of a project to improve civil registration and vital statistics. The main activities of the project include the development of a training manual and a training seminar for improving vital statistics and assisting countries to implement the newly revised *Principles and Recommendations for a Vital Statistics System*. The training seminar, planned for the second half of 1999, will also provide an opportunity to disseminate the five *Handbooks* referred to above.

III. 2000 World Population and Housing Census Programme

5. The *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses, Revision 1*⁸ were published in English in May 1998. The United Nations Statistics Division submitted them for translation in February 1998, and the Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian and Spanish versions of the *Principles and Recommendations* are in press.

6. To supplement the *Principles and Recommendations*, the Division, in collaboration with UNFPA, is preparing three handbooks as additions to the series *Handbooks of Population and Housing Censuses* — a handbook on geographic information systems (GIS) and digital mapping for census activities, a second handbook on population and housing census edits, and a handbook on census management; drafts will be reviewed in the first half of 1999. In addition, in collaboration with the International Labour Organization, a guide for the collection of economic characteristics in population censuses was drafted and reviewed by an expert group held in New York from 18 to 21 May 1998. All four handbooks will be submitted for publication in the official United Nations languages during 1999, and will be distributed widely and used in regional and interregional training seminars. In addition, the Division is planning to develop a handbook on fertility and mortality data collection. This handbook will synthesize various approaches used in the collection of data on fertility and mortality, their appropriateness under different environments, data evaluation techniques, and suggestions to improve the quality of data obtained from population censuses and surveys; it is expected to be ready by 2001.

7. In partnership with UNFPA, the United Nations Statistics Division is undertaking interregional and regional training to assist countries in conducting a census of population and housing in the 2000 census decade. In 1997, the Division organized a training seminar for the

Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) and another for the Pacific States. The objectives of those meetings were to (a) discuss and implement common questions in censuses among neighbouring countries, (b) establish subregional networks for cooperation among countries, and (c) share technical expertise to enhance capacity-building. The first meeting, held at Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan, in March 1997, was attended by six of the Central Asian Republics, including Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan and Mongolia. The CIS Statistical Committee, the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) and the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) also participated. The second meeting took place at Nadi, Fiji, in December 1997, where 17 Pacific island countries participated. The deliberations at these two meetings helped the Division to identify topics where handbooks were needed most. A third meeting is planned in Africa for early 1999 to address similar issues among the 14 countries of the Southern Africa Development Community. The draft handbooks will be further discussed at this meeting. If funds can be mobilized, similar seminars will be organized for other regions or subregions. A list of census dates is contained in the annex.

8. As a follow-up to these meetings, two three-week training workshops in data processing were organized. The first was held at Suva, Fiji, for the Pacific Island States in July 1998, and the second, for the Central Asian Republics, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan and Mongolia, in October 1998 at Almaty, Kazakhstan. In addition, national training workshops in census operations were held in the Central Asian countries which are planning their censuses for 1999.

9. In addition, an interregional seminar, planned for 1999 in collaboration between UNFPA and the Division, will discuss the implementation of the revised *Principles and Recommendations* and the census handbooks that focus on implementation of new technologies in census mapping and GIS, census editing and census management.

10. The regional commissions are also undertaking activities to improve the census-taking capacity of countries in their regions. The Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA) conducted a regional workshop on the theme "Strategies for the 2000 round of population and housing censuses" at Cairo in December 1997. Participants discussed the use of new technologies in data collection, processing and dissemination for forthcoming population and housing censuses; emphasized the importance of designing data products for use in policy-making; and dealt with the importance of meeting statistical needs in cost-effective ways.

11. The Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean and the Latin American Demographic Centre have organized several regional seminars. First, in collaboration with the National Bureau of Statistics of Colombia, a seminar was held to build on conclusions from the 1990 round. A second seminar was held with countries of the Southern Cone Common Market to promote comparability of censuses in the region. A forthcoming meeting in Chile in October 1998 will focus on the treatment of issues for the 2000 censuses.

12. ESCAP, in collaboration with UNFPA, is implementing a project on the theme "Application of new technology in population data collection, processing, dissemination and presentation" to promote the effective utilization of modern technology for population data, with emphasis on sharing experiences in the region through meetings of a working party. The first meeting of the working party, held at Bangkok in September 1997, focused on recent developments in the application of information technology. The second meeting, held in Singapore in April 1998, focused on the use of the Internet for collection and dissemination in the 2000 censuses, with emphasis on data security, World Wide Web publishing and database systems. A third meeting, scheduled for January 1999 at Bali, Indonesia, will focus on data capture, coding, verification and work flow.

13. ECE convened a meeting in September 1997 of potential donors and representatives of CIS and former Yugoslavia countries to obtain resources for conducting forthcoming population and housing censuses. A document prepared for the meeting set out the estimated costs for each country in three areas: training; equipment; and materials and supplies. ECE also organized five workshops to improve the census-taking capacity of countries in transition in the region. Two workshops focused on the content and technology of pilot censuses, two dealt with planning the use of GIS in the census, and one was devoted to post-collection activities, including data processing, quality control and coverage measurement, dissemination and marketing.

14. Each regional commission has conducted technical assistance missions on population and housing censuses in countries within their respective regions through their advisers, based in UNFPA country support teams. The advisers provide technical assistance in the area of population statistics, particularly for the planning and organization of 2000 round of population and housing censuses, census analysis and associated data processing.

IV. Social statistics

15. Following the global plan of action contained in the Habitat Agenda⁹ adopted at the United Nations Conference on Human Settlements (Habitat II) and as a basis for follow-up to the decisions taken at the Conference, the United Nations Statistics Division, together with the United Nations Centre for Human Settlements, is preparing the next edition of the *Compendium of Human Settlements Statistics*. Work is expected to be complete in 1999.

16. In the areas of crime and criminal justice statistics, a draft guide towards the development of a national system of criminal justice information is being prepared by the Canadian Centre for Criminal Justice Statistics, Statistics Canada, in cooperation with the United Nations Statistics Division and the International Centre for Crime Prevention of the United Nations Office at Vienna. This guide is an updated and revised version of the *Manual for the Development of Criminal Justice Statistics*.¹⁰

17. Country tables from *The World's Women 1995: Trends and Statistics*,¹¹ updated yearly, are available in the United Nations Statistics Division Web site (at www.un.org/depts/unsd/gender/intro.htm). A second Web site, "Social indicators" (at <http://www.un.org/depts/unsd/social/main.htm>) disseminates a set of 26 social indicators by sex, where available, which covers 206 countries and areas; it is updated every quarter.

18. The Division has also issued the *Handbook for Producing National Statistical Reports on Women and Men*.¹² The *Handbook* is an operational guide for national statistical offices and gender programmes in the compilation of gender statistics and their dissemination in a non-technical format. Extensive distribution in each of the United Nations languages is being undertaken by the agencies which supported the preparation of the publication: the United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Children's Fund, UNFPA, the United Nations Development Fund for Women, the International Fund for Agricultural Development and the World Food Programme.

19. At its twenty-eighth session, the Statistical Commission emphasized the value of time-use statistics for a range of national and international socio-economic statistics, including gender statistics, and requested that a draft classification of time-use activities be prepared by the United Nations Statistics Division as a basis for further research and special studies.¹³ A trial international classification of activities for time-use statistics was developed and reviewed by an expert group meeting held in New York from 13 to 16 October 1997. The classification

at the 2-digit level, revised according to the recommendations of the expert group, is available on the Division's Web site (at www.un.org/depts/unsd/timeuse/inter.htm). The next phase of work on time use involves its development into a 3-digit classification for testing by selected countries in order to improve the measurement of paid and unpaid work.

V. International migration statistics

20. *Recommendations on Statistics of International Migration*,¹⁴ developed in cooperation with the United Nations Population Division, were published in October 1998 and sent for translation on 21 May 1998; translation and publication in the other United Nations official languages is under way. The Population Division will also assist the United Nations, Statistics Division in the distribution of the *Recommendations*.

Annex

Population and housing census dates, 1990 and 2000 rounds of censuses

Updated on 15 September 1998

In accordance with Economic and Social Council resolutions, the 1990 World Population and Housing Census Programme covered the 10-year period from 1985 through 1994, and the 2000 World Population and Housing Census Programme covers the 1995–2004 decade.

The data set out below includes (a) the data of the population and/or housing census for each country or area that participated in the 1990 Programme, and (b) either the actual date for each country or area that has already conducted a population and housing census in the 2000 Programme, or the anticipated date for each country or area for which it can be assumed at this time that a census is likely to be held before the end of 2004.

Unless otherwise noted, the dates refer to complete (100 per cent) enumeration, even though some topics have been investigated on a sample basis.

Indications and symbols are used as follows:

- Date : Official national census date
- PH : Population and housing census
- P : Population census
- H : Housing census
- T : Census was reported as taken
- A : Provision by the United Nations of a resident technical expert or financial assistance
- [Year] : A census was planned for that year but there is no evidence available to the United Nations that it was carried out
- (Year) : Reasonable anticipation that a census will be held in the year indicated
- (...) : Reasonable anticipation that a census will be held during the decade
- ... : No basis for anticipation at this time
- : No census taken
