## **Paris Group on Labour and Compensation**

### **Purpose**

To examine, assess and reconcile the various sources of information used to measure labour market conditions and compensation, particularly in the context of the deregulation of labour markets and structural unemployment, and to contribute to improving concepts and their implementation, as well as the construction of new indicators.

### **Year organized**

1997

### **Participants**

Current participants: Argentina, Australia, Canada, Denmark, France, Japan, Netherlands, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, United States, International Labour Organization, Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), Statistical Office of the European Communities.

### **Meetings**

Paris, 27 and 28 November 1997.

London, 6 and 7 July 1998.

Paris, 18 and 19 November 1999.

Örebro, Sweden, 20 and 21 September 2000.

### **Topics considered**

1. Key labour market indicators; labour market dynamics; reconciliation of estimates of employment (and unemployment) from different sources; typologies of patterns of activities.
2. Hours worked: discussions on the various approaches to the measurement of annual working time and the uses of these measures (for national accounts, evaluation of productivity etc.).
3. Compensation: earnings distribution and analysis of employment-related income.
