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## **Annotations**

### **1. Election of officers**

In accordance with rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council and past practices, the Statistical Commission, at the commencement of its first meeting of a regular session, shall elect, from among the representatives of its members, a Chairman, three Vice-Chairmen and a Rapporteur.

The Bureau serves for two years. This is achieved by electing the Bureau for a period of one year and re-electing those members of the Bureau who continue to be representatives to the Commission at the following session. The Bureau is elected based on the principle of equitable geographical distribution — a member of the Bureau is elected from each of the regions represented on the Commission.

### **2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters**

The items on the provisional agenda and the corresponding documentation were proposed by the Commission at its thirty-third session (New York, 5-8 March 2002)<sup>1</sup> and approved by the Council in its decision 2002/298. Some changes have been made, in consultation with the Officers of the Commission. The proposed draft organization of work is before the Commission. The Commission may wish to adopt the agenda and organization of work for the session.

### 3. Demographic and social statistics

#### (a) Population and housing censuses

The report discusses the actions taken by the Commission at its thirty-third session,<sup>2</sup> and discusses how the United Nations Statistics Division proposes to incorporate the proposed activities into its work programme for 2003, the 2004-2005 biennium and subsequent bienniums.

#### (b) Health statistics

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by the World Health Organization (WHO), which focuses on developments since the report submitted to the Commission at its thirty-third session. The report includes the recommendations of the Scientific Peer Review Group, consultations with countries and developments with the *World Health Survey*.

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by the Australian Bureau of Statistics, which briefly describes the current Australian system of health statistics. The report outlines the various sources of data and the frameworks used for organizing the outputs; lists the policy drivers and key issues that health statistics seek to inform, together with the data gaps and measurement issues confronting health statisticians; and suggests areas where international collaboration might be valuable in advancing the system of health statistics within countries.

The Commission will have before it a report on pressing issues in the area of health statistics in Botswana; the Commission may wish to comment on the issues raised in the report.

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat). The report finds that the adoption of a new community action programme on public health<sup>3</sup> has given an extra impetus to the further development of the statistical element of health information within the context of the community statistical programme for 2003-2007. The general emphasis is on reinforcement of the infrastructure for the basic system on public health statistics (at the member State and European Union levels) and on harmonization and improvement of the comparability of existing data; actions will be carried out in cooperation with international organizations active in this field, in particular WHO and the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development.

**4. Economic statistics**

**(a) National accounts**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Task Force on National Accounts (Convener: Intersecretariat Working Group on National Accounts (ISWGNA)). Regarding the updating of the System of National Accounts, 1993 (1993 SNA),<sup>4</sup> the report addresses the ISWGNA recommendation regarding the accrual accounting of interest, discussions and conclusions on other topics; the review of the current updating mechanism; and the ISWGNA recommendations for improving the mechanism. The report also provides information regarding the assessment of the implementation of the 1993 SNA.

Under points for discussion, the Commission will be requested to express its views on:

(a) The proposed criteria for identifying issues that are candidates for updating;

(b) The proposed updating mechanism in which ISWGNA will play a managing role, with the assistance of the ISWGNA Advisory Group on National Accounts;

(c) The proposed deadline of 2005 for resolving issues and the publication target of 2008 for the revised 1993 SNA;

(d) The proposed list of issues recommended for review in the updating process (see annex II to the report);

(e) The terms of reference of the Canberra II Group.

**(b) Measuring the new economy**

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by the Office for National Statistics of the United Kingdom on a conference held by the International Association of Official Statistics (IAOS) in 2002 on the theme "Official statistics and the new economy". The report summarizes the conclusions of the conference, which cover the priorities for change in national accounts and other statistics to deal with structural changes due to information and communication technology, as well as leading issues in social statistics related to information society measurement. In addition, the report contains the views of the conference on appropriate actions to be taken by international organizations to meet the requirements for change. The Commission may wish to review the conclusions and recommendations for action.

**(c) Agriculture statistics**

**(d) Statistics of services (programme review)**

Issues of measurement in current values, prices and volume measures are covered. The report identifies areas in which further international collaboration might be useful and suggests modalities for how that might happen.

**(f) International merchandise trade statistics**

The Commission may wish to comment on the progress and plans of the Task Force in both the methodological and data aspects of its work.

**5. Natural resources and environment statistics**

The report on environment statistics contains (a) a summary analysis and assessment of the results of the two international data-collection exercises that the United Nations Statistics Division carried out in 1999 and 2001, following a recommendation of the former Working Group on International Statistical Programmes and Coordination made in 1998; and (b) a proposal for a programme for the regular collection, compilation and dissemination of international environment statistics. The Commission may wish to comment on the evaluation of the results and discuss the suggested priorities and proposed work programme.

**6. Activities not classified by field****(a) International economic and social classifications**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Secretary-General, which will describe work undertaken in the area of international classifications during the previous year and steps planned for the future. The report will summarize the recommendations made by the Expert Group on International Economic and Social Classifications and its technical subgroup. Detailed recommendations for the 2007 revisions of the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC)<sup>5</sup> and the Central Product Classification (CPC)<sup>6</sup> will be available in a concept paper as a separate background document.

The Commission may wish to:

(a) Comment on the recommendations for the revision of ISIC and CPC as outlined in the concept paper;

(b) Comment on the planned further steps in the revision process.

**(b) Harmonization of indicators and reporting on progress towards the millennium development goals**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Secretary-General. The report describes the activities of the United Nations Statistics Division undertaken to follow up the recommendations of the Friends of the Chair that were endorsed by the Commission at its thirty-third session.<sup>7</sup> The Commission may wish to provide guidance for future work by the Division in this area and for the newly established standing advisory committee on development indicators.

The report also describes the work of the Division to prepare data and analysis for monitoring progress towards the achievement of the millennium development goals at the global and regional levels; it also discusses the millennium development goals indicator set in the context of data-quality issues, availability problems and the implications that the indicators have for statistical capacity-building. In particular, the report addresses the lack of international statistical standards and recommendations in some areas, as highlighted within the millennium development goals reporting framework.

The Commission will also have before it a note by the Secretary-General transmitting the report of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) on national millennium indicators. The report will address statistical issues in the context of country-level monitoring of progress towards the millennium development goals.

**(c) Statistical capacity-building**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Secretary-General, containing a brief description of the technical cooperation programme of the United Nations Statistics Division. The Commission may wish to discuss the report and comment on the technical cooperation programme of the Division.

In its annual report to the Commission, the Partnership in Statistics for Development in the Twenty-first Century (PARIS 21) provides a brief outline of its progress to date, future direction and forthcoming evaluation. The report summarizes the outputs achieved from advocacy work, information-sharing, task team activities and subregional/country workshops undertaken in the 2002 calendar year. The annex contains a summary of the indicators produced by the team convened by the International Monetary Fund to develop indicators of statistical capacity-building.

The Commission may wish to:

- (a) Note the progress of PARIS 21 to date and the impending evaluation of the initiative;



- (b) Comment on its future direction and programme;
- (c) Review the proposed indicators of statistical capacity-building.

**(d) Follow-up to Economic and Social Council policy decisions**

This item was placed on the agenda by the Commission at the request of the Economic and Social Council in its resolution 1999/51. The aims are to encourage a closer relationship between the work of the Commission and of the Council. The Commission will have before it a note by the Secretary-General containing extracts from Council resolutions, decisions and agreed conclusions that are relevant to the work of the Commission and the actions taken or planned by the Commission. The Commission may wish to decide upon any action that may be necessary.

**(e) Coordination and integration of statistical programmes**

At its thirty-third session, the Commission requested<sup>8</sup> the international organizations to develop a new system for effective coordination given that the ACC Subcommittee on Statistical Activities had been disbanded. To address that concern, an inter-agency meeting was held in New York from 17 to 19 September 2002, the report of which will be before the Commission. At that meeting, it was decided to establish the Committee for the Coordination of Statistical Activities. The Commission may wish to take into account, in its discussions under relevant agenda items, the views expressed by the inter-agency meeting.

The Commission will also have before it a report on the coordination of statistical data collection from countries as a follow-up to its discussions in 2001 and 2002.<sup>9</sup> The report describes the work of the United Nations Statistics Division, in collaboration with other international organizations, to eliminate duplication in data collection from countries. The Commission may wish to endorse the approach taken by the Division and other international bodies.
