1992/260. Non-submission of reports by States parties

At its 32nd plenary meeting, on 20 July 1992, the Economic and Social Council, recalling the concern that it had frequently expressed at the non-submission of reports by States parties to international human rights treaties, appealed to the following States parties to the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights²⁷ for more than ten years, which have yet to submit even the initial report required by the Covenant, to do so as soon as possible: Bolivia, Central African Republic, Egypt, El Salvador, Gambia, Guinea, Kenya, Lebanon, Mali, Mauritius, Morocco, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka and Suriname. The Council noted that these States might wish to avail themselves of the advisory services available from the Centre for Human Rights of the Secretariat to assist them in the preparation of their over-due reports.
