

**1995/303. Resources to enable the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights to obtain access to specialized expertise in its work**

At its 52nd plenary meeting, on 25 July 1995, the Economic and Social Council endorsed the proposal made by the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights that an amount of 10,000 United States dollars annually be included within the overall budget of the Centre for Human Rights of the Secretariat, to enable the Committee to bring in specialists to participate in its general discussion and to commission papers dealing with those technical dimensions of its work, especially relating to indicators, which require expert elaboration. The Council noted that the proposal of the Committee accorded with the recommendation of the World Conference on Human Rights in relation to indicators and that the relevant funds would not be spent on members of the Committee and would be committed only with the approval of the Assistant Secretary-General for Human Rights.
