

1995/320. Membership of the Commission on Population and Development

At its 60th plenary meeting, on 12 December 1995, the Economic and Social Council decided:

(a) That the membership of the Commission on Population and Development should be increased from twenty-seven to forty-seven, according to the following pattern:

Twelve members from African States;

Eleven members from Asian States;

Five members from Eastern European States;

Nine members from Latin American and Caribbean States;

Ten members from Western European and other States;

(b) That the members of the Commission should be elected by the Council from among the States Members of the United Nations and members of the specialized agencies before the opening of the twenty-ninth session of the Commission.
