

ECOSOC Decision 2004/274

Corruption and its impact on the full enjoyment of human rights, in particular economic, social and cultural rights

At its 49th plenary meeting, on 22 July 2004, the Economic and Social Council took note of Commission on Human Rights decision 2004/106 of 16 April 2004¹ and endorsed the Commission's:

(a) Decision to appoint Ms. Christy Mbonu as special rapporteur with the task of preparing a comprehensive study on corruption and its impact on the full enjoyment of human rights, in particular economic, social and cultural rights, based on her working paper² as well as the comments received and the useful discussions that took place at the fifty-fifth session of the Subcommission on the Promotion and Protection of Human Rights;

(b) Request to the Special Rapporteur to submit a preliminary report to the Subcommission at its fifty-sixth session, a progress report at its fifty-seventh session and a final report at its fifty-eighth session;

(c) Decision to endorse the request to the Secretary-General to provide the Special Rapporteur with all the assistance necessary to enable her to accomplish her task.
