In implementing the Kyoto Declaration, the Commission holds annual thematic discussions to facilitate exchange of good practices, challenges and lessons learned in advancing crime prevention, criminal justice and the rule of law. The fourth round of thematic discussions, focusing on Pillar IV of the Kyoto Declaration - Promoting international cooperation and technical assistance to prevent and address all forms of crime - was held from 2-4 December 2024. 🔗



Joint responses to "leave no one behind"



At the regular 33rd session in May 2024, the Commission adopted 5 resolutions covering topics including: preparations for the United Nations Crime Congress; trafficking in persons; treatment of children associated with terrorist groups; reducing reoffending; and violence against children by organized criminal groups and terrorist groups.

Roadmap to the 15th UN Crime Congress

The General Assembly decided on the organizational arrangements for the 15th Congress, to be held from 25 to 30 April 2026 in Abu Dhabi, and on the main theme of the Congress, which will be "Accelerating crime prevention, criminal justice and the rule of law: protecting people and planet and achieving the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in the digital age".
